California wildfires: How to help victims of Camp, Woolsey, Hill fires:

- AT&T and the [American Red Cross](#) are partnering to help. You can choose to donate to "California Wildfires" or other causes at, or by texting "CAWILDFIRES" to 90999.

- The California Community Foundation's Wildfire Relief Fund offers a wide variety of support to victims, including those who have been displaced or who have lost their homes, belongings, or employment, or who have suffered mental and physical problems. You can make a donation [online](#).
- [North Valley Community Foundation](#): This nonprofit in Chico is raising money to support organizations that are sheltering evacuees of the Camp Fire. These could include churches, fairgrounds and community centers, said Logan Todd, a foundation spokesman.
