### 6. PUBLIC COMMENT

Betty Lucke inquired how events are promoted on the library's website and how to navigate the events calendar on the Library's website. She stated the Local Author Showcase at Vacaville Town Square library was not promoted on the Library's website. Ms. Olawski stated the Library promotes countywide events on its website. Branch events are promoted on the events calendar, at outreach events, via social media, through media releases, via partnerships, and in library branches. Ms. Lucke also stated it is hard to find books when searching the catalog as the call numbers are not evident; they appear by clicking on the library branch where the book is shelved. Ms. Lucke stated something needs to be fixed in the system when searching the catalog.

The Council reviewed Ms. Olawski's written report. Ms. Olawski reported at the May 2, 2023 Solano County Board of Supervisors meeting, the Board took action to merge the Independent Citizens Oversight Committee for Measure L with the Solano County Library Advisory Council. Ms. Olawski stated she is working with the County Administrator's office on merger of both committees and will bring back more information to the Council when it is available.

The City of Vallejo approved a contract with Restoration Management Company to start fire damage repairs to the JFK Library.

Ms. Olawski highlighted from her report that the library will be implementing a new marketing software tool, Savannah by OrangeBoy. This software allows the library to reach out to people in our service population who do not have library cards. The library has partnered with the Behavioral Health division of Solano County Health and Social Services to offer two events, "1 Degree of Separation: A Look at Depression" at Vallejo JFK Library and Fairfield Civic Center Library





### **PERSONNEL**

### **OPERATIONS**

### **Facilities**

- Vallejo Springstowne Library
  - The new air conditioner unit has been malfunctioning lately. The County has loaned a portable AC unit to the branch as backup until the permanent unit is repaired.
- Vacaville Cultural Center Library
  - The Vacaville Unified School District/Library District Board has approved a budget and schematic design of an addition to and renovation of the Vacaville Cultural Center Library.
- Cooling Centers
  - All library branches serve as cooling centers during heat related events. Office of Emergency Services promotes the locations and provides cases of water for community access.

### Information Technology

People Counters: Sensoure people counters have been installed at each of our nine branches. These new people counters are mounted on the ceiling (or somewhere else high up) near the entrance and use 3D imaging for more accurate counts. Along with more accurate people counts that can, for example, tell the difference between an adult and a child, we will also get information on traffic patterns, which would show us our busiest days/times. Many libraries are using these sensors to get more accurate counts than security gates can give.

Communico: Communico is a software company that provides one system for event booking, room booking, digital signage that is connected to the calendar system, and patron self-service (checking out, account maintenance, etc.) that will run on ELO kiosks. All the Communico modules are connected so there is only one staff interface to access all these modules.

Devices: 300 T-Mobile hotspots, 250 tablets (175 going to Literacy, the rest going into regular circulation), and 25 Chromebooks are available for the public to check out. These devices were purchased with ARPA funds from the County. These funds cover two years' worth of data built into each of the devices. We have 63 more hotspots from Verizon that are currently in processing. These 63 hotspots will be dedicated to Rio Vista to help close the coverage gap in that city.

### FY2023-24 Budget

The Board of Supervisors passed the County's FY2023-24 budget of \$1.5B on June 22, 2023, inclusive of the Library's \$32.7M budget, which your Council approved in March 2023. The Library had submitted the following Supplemental items: \$1,000,000 increase in Library Fund Reserves offset by a decrease to Fund Balance – Contingency to ensure adequate reserve levels in the event of an economic downturn; \$100,000 increase professional services costs for mass mailing marketing services and to reupholster chairs at the Fairfield Civic Center Library, offset by a decrease in Fund Balance – Contingency; \$42,000 increase in building improvement costs for the Fairfield Civic Center Library Parking Lot Improvement Project, offset by a decrease in Fund Balance – Contingency.

### STAFF DEVELOPMENT

- California Library Association (CLA) Conference June 1-3, 2023 in Sacramento. This annual conference serves
  as the foremost professional development opportunity in the state for librarians and library staff. Twenty (20)
  staff members attended the conference. Kevin Tolley, Library Branch Manager, serves on the CLA membership
  committee and assisted with the planning and implementation of this year's conference. Rali Garcia, Library
  Associate, serves on the CLA African American Librarians Interest Group and was the group's Outreach &
  Recruitment Chair at the conference.
- American Library Association (ALA) Annual Conference June 22-27, 2023 in Chicago, IL. The ALA Annual Conference & Exhibition draws thousands of librarians and library staff, educators, authors, publishers, friends of libraries, trustees, special guests, and exhibitors from across the country. The conference offers educational programming; important announcements and updates; relevant legislation and policies; and discussions that majorly impact libraries, their roles, and their ongoing transformation. Makayla Walker, Library Associate, was selected as a Spectrum Scholar of the American Library Association. Makayla was one of 60 individuals in the U.S. to obtain this prestigious scholarship, which is awarded to individuals pursuing graduate degrees in library and information studies. Through the Spectrum Scholarship Program, ALA affirms its commitment to diversity and inclusion by seeking the broadest participation of new generations of racially and ethnically diverse librarians to position ALA to provide leadership in the transformation of libraries and library services.
- Future of Libraries Conference October 18, 2022 in San Francisco. This is a one-day annual conference held in the fall highlighting innovations taking place in libraries today. This year's program featured how to serve communities in a rapidly changing world and the librarians' role in teaching critical thinking and empathy in an

age of disinformation. Other topics included conflicts around digital lending and non-traditional library collections. Twelve (12) staff members attended the conference.

### **COLLECTIONS, RESOURCES & SERVICES**

### Collections

- > Dash Robot: Dash is a robot for kids 6 years and older. It teaches kids how to code and is used in STEAM/STEM programming. These will be available as kits for checkouts as well as for programming. This item will be available to check out soon.
- Musical Instruments: Newly added instruments include an Otamatone (a Japanese musical instrument that's shaped like a musical note and sounds like a theremin, an electronic musical instrument invented in 1919), Pearl Cajon (a box-shaped percussion instrument originally from Peru, played by slapping the front or rear faces with the hands, fingers, or sometimes implements such as brushes, mallets, or sticks); banjo; and left-handed guitar.
- Tonies and Toniebox: a child-friendly audio system that allows kids to listen to music and stories using a portable speaker called a Toniebox which is operated using colorful figures called Tonies. A headphone jack also allows the Toniebox to be used at quieter times. Its intent is to introduce pre-readers and developing readers to the wonders of narrative before they can read the words in a book.

### **PROGRAMS**

### 2023 Annual Reading Program: Solano Reads

Solano Reads is an all-ages, community-wide celebration of all kinds of reading and encourages reading 20 books during calendar year 2023. Registration is online or at any Solano County Library branch. Commemorative pins are available at sign-up, when 20 books have been read, and if more than 20 books have been read. There currently are 2,675 registrations.

### 2023 Lunch at the Library

All branches are participating as either a library meal site, pop-up library at a community meal site and/or a farm to summer site. Dixon Library, Fairfield Civic Center Library, Vacaville Town Square Library, and Vallejo John F. Kennedy Library are serving as meal sites. Vacaville Town Square Library also is serving breakfast. Each of the sites is hosting programs and activities around the lunchtimes so families have access to enrichment and educational opportunities as part of the program. The State Library's Lunch at the Library grant also allows for the provision of free books for the children attending the lunch programs with the intent of helping families create home libraries. Grant funds also support programs that emphasize eating healthy, local produce as well as gardening. All branches are offering cooking and gardening programs. Of note: the Rio Vista Library has added a small demonstration garden; the Vallejo Springstowne Library is partnering with Loma Vista Farm for its Summer Fun on the Farm camp by using grant funds for book giveaway for children participating in the summer camp; and several branches have offered smoothie programs that have been popular with all ages. Grant funds also will be used to purchase garden tools, which users will be able to borrow to start their own vegetable gardens, and seeds for our seed libraries.

To date, 5,384 meals have been served at the Library.
