# Minutes of the SOLANO COUNTY LIBRARY ADVISORY COUNCIL Monday, January 25, 2016

1. CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by Chair Miller at 6:30 p.m.

# 2. ROLL CALL AND ESTABLISHMENT OF QUORUM:

- 3. INTRODUCTIONS: None.
- 4. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES AS MAILED FOR MEETING OF November 16, 2015:</u> Ms. Schenk moved to approve the minutes of the November 16, 2015 meeting; seconded by Mr. Heinrich. Motion carried. So ordered by 8-0.
- 5. <u>APPROVAL OF AGENDA</u>. Mr. DuClair moved to approve the January 25, 2016 agenda; Ms. Barney seconded. Motion carried. So ordered by 8-0 vote.
- 6. PUBLIC COMMENT: None.
- 7. CORRESPONDENCE: None.
- 8. <u>DIRECTOR'S REPORT:</u> Ms. Katz announced that the Library is still in recruitment mode. Current recruitments are: Supervising Librarian, Literacy Program Manager, Librarian and Departmental Aide.

Ms. Katz reported that the Request for Proposal for the Strategic Plan has been submitted to Purchasing and is hoping to hire a firm sometime in March. Ms. Katz predicts the process will last between 6-9 months.

Career Online High School update – the Library had 36 people that expressed interest, 12 registered for the program and four people actually completed all of the steps and are ready to be interviewed. There are six slots available and if they are unable to be filled with Vallejo residents, the Library will open up the program to the rest of the County.

Ms. Katz distributed the new winter Check It Out and the 2015 Solano County Annual Report.

## 9. OLD BUSINESS:

FY 2015-2016 Budget - The Council will receive an update on the FY 2015-2016 budget

The mid-year budget has been completed and submitted to the County Administrator. Revenues are up approximately \$400,000. Also, because of all of the vacancies, the Library has been able to absorb the cost of the new contract with the union and still have approximately \$1 million in salary savings. Ms. Katz does expect to see personnel costs rise due to filling vacancies and increases in PERS and health costs.

## 10. NEW BUSINESS:

a. Vallejo Library Advisory Board – the Commission will discuss the Vallejo Library Advisory Board.

The subcommittee of the City Council recommended to the Vallejo City Council to eliminate several boards and commissions including the Vallejo Library Advisory Board. There was no objection from the City Council or the VLAB. The VLAB has been in existence since the merger agreement in 1974. At the time, the City of Vallejo contributed funds to the Library which they no longer do. Now the City of Vallejo will be able to appoint a representative to the Solano County Library Advisory Council and that representative will be able to report back to the city about library issues. The process involves a municipal code change which requires two readings of the code changes. In response to Ms. Vaughan's inquiry, Ms. Katz stated that this does not close the door in revitalizing the city's contributing funds to the Library.

b. Topics/goals of the Solano County Library Advisory Council – the Council will discuss their topics/goals for the coming year.

Suggested topics for the coming year:

- more hours
- security
- community education
- PAWS programs
- literacy
- volunteers
- more local and bay area authors
- effects of Napa pulling out of SNAP
- little libraries i.e. libraries in the laundry, to find the people whose needs are not being met
- · eBook focus, social media

Ms. Katz added that many of these questions and topics will be discussed with focus groups during the strategic planning and expressed that the Council will be involved in this process.

c. Election of Officers – the Council will elect a Chair and Vice-Chair for 2016.

Ms. Miller moved to appoint Mr. Overholt to be Chair; Ms. Schenk seconded. Motion carried. So ordered by a 8-0 vote

Ms. Schenk moved to appoint Ms. Barney as Vice-Chair; Mr. Hall seconded. Motion carried. So ordered by a 8-0 vote.

## Report of the Director of Library Services to the Solano County Library Advisory Council May 2016

#### Personnel

### Staff changes/promotions

Nancy Wilson has been promoted to Deputy Director of Support Services. Nancy most recently was the Supervising Librarian at Technical Services where she oversaw the operations of the division including collection development, acquisitions, cataloging/processing and delivery.

Michael Perkins will be reassigned to the Vacaville Cultural Center Library to work as a full – time adult services librarian. Jennifer Lariviere has been reassigned to the Suisun City Library as a full-time Library Associate.

Michael Threats, full time library assistant at the Fairfield Civic Center Library will be reassigned to the full time library assistant position at the Springstowne Library which occurred when Loida Masalaysay promoted to the Library Associate position at the Suisun City Library.

#### Recruitments

We have held interviews for the Supervising Librarian positions and have hired John Parker as the new supervising librarian at the Vacaville Town Square Library. Most recently John worked for the Las Vegas/Clark County Library District where he served as the department head for a busy computer center. In addition, John has overseen public service, circulation and computer center functions and has participated in several system-wide projects.

We currently have a job offer extended to another candidate for the supervising librarian position at Technical Services.

Cherelyn Hunt has accepted the position of Literacy Program Manager. Cherelyn has worked for Solano County since 2006, most recently as a Contract and Programs Specialist at First 5 Solano for the past 10 years. As a local resident and community activist, Cherelyn has close ties with Solano County nonprofit and civic organizations which include serving on the Board of Directors for the Solano County Library Foundation.

We are currently recruiting for 1.5 FTE library aide positions due to promotions and reassignments.

We have finished the interviews for the two .5 library associate positions as well as the two full time librarian positions and hope to be able to make job offers shortly.

As part of the third quarter financial report we requested a .5 Literacy Program Assistant position and an Administrative Services Manager position to replace the Senior Staff Analyst position. Both of these requests were approved by the Board of Supervisors.

As you can tell from above, we continue to be in the recruitment mode.

There was plenty to do at the Library during National Library Week. Activities included a weekend-long scavenger hunt; a visit with local wildlife presented by the Suisun Wildlife Center; the Master Gardeners speaking about Square Foot Gardening and at another event, Drought
