Report of the Director of Library Services to the Solano County Library Advisory Council January 2024

PERSONNEL

The Library is pleased to share the following staff announcements:

- Rali Garcia has been promoted to the position of Librarian at the Dixon Library. Rali earned her Master of
 Library and Information Science from the University of Denver, graduating June 2023. Rali previously
 worked as a Library Associate at the Suisun City Library and the Library's former Telephone Assistance
 Center.
- Melinda Knowling has been promoted to the position of Library Associate at the Vallejo John F. Kennedy
 Library. Melinda previously worked as a Library Aide at the Vacaville Cultural Center Library.
- Mychal Threets, Supervising Librarian Fairfield Civic Center Library, is one of ten recipients of the American Library Association's (ALA) 2024 "I Love My Librarian Award" for outstanding public service, selected from 1,400 candidates nominated by library users nationwide. Mychal has become a social media sensation over the course of the past year, rising to the level of "library influencer" as described recently by the New York Times. Through his social media channels, Mychal promotes the value of public libraries and how everyone is welcomed and can receive help with their needs. Mychal primarily uses his TikTok and Instagram accounts (@mychal3ts) for his posts, which highlight positive experiences of library users. Mychal has put a spotlight on the value of public libraries, most especially how public libraries are community hubs that bring people together, close the opportunity gap by connecting people to essential services and resources, support vulnerable populations, and most especially how they are free and open to all. Mychal's achievement will be recognized at the ALA LibLearnX Conference in Baltimore, MD on January 19, 2024.
- Mychal Threets, Supervising Librarian Fairfield Civic Center Library, Joan Parker, Librarian Fairfield Civic Center Library, and Rali Garcia, Librarian Dixon Library, were selected as recipients of the (Solano County) Tri-City NAACP Unsung Hero Award for their unwavering dedication to fostering the love of learning, exploration, and literature in Solano County residents. Mychal, Joan, and Rali will be recognized for their achievements at the Tri-City NAACP Gala on February 3, 2024 at the Paradise Valley Golf Course. The gala's theme: "Inspiring the Next Generation and Nurturing Young Black Leaders for a Brighter Future."

OPERATIONS

Organizational Study

The Library is undergoing an organizational study conducted by an outside consultant to examine and assess current resources to plan for the future. The study will identify approaches and changes that support staff to serve a changing and diverse community. The organizational study will also conduct a review of existing personnel resources which will examine current job classifications with the goal of recommending changes, modifications and potential new descriptions that align with the nature of work required to meet the needs of the respective library communities with the resources available. The study also will focus on the organizational structure to determine any recommended changes to better leverage the library's resource capacity. The goal will be to recommend effective ways to utilize existing management, staff, and financial resources. This process is expected to conclude mid to late summer.

CA State Funding

The State is facing a \$68B budget shortfall and based on the Governor's released draft budget, support for two library programs is at risk: Local Library Infrastructure Grant program and California State Library Park Pass program.

Support for Local Library Infrastructure — "The Budget proposes to <u>pull back</u> \$131.3 million one-time General Fund of the \$439 million in one-time General Fund support provided for the Local Library Infrastructure Grant Program in the 2021 Budget Act and proposes to forgo planned one-time General Fund investments of \$33 million in 2024-25, \$33 million in 2025-26, and \$34 million in 2026-27."

The City of Vallejo is at risk of losing their grant award of \$4,317,967 for energy and mechanical improvements to the John F. Kennedy Library.

California State Library Park Pass: About 68 million people visit California state parks every year, but getting in for free might get harder for California residents as Newsom proposes to eliminate funding for the California State Library Parks Pass, which allows Californians with a library card to get a day-use vehicle pass to 200 state parks for free (typically saving \$10-\$15 per vehicle.) Newsom's proposal would also shift funding for the California State Park Adventure Pass, which allows fourth graders and their families free entry to state parks, to Proposition 98. These programs are part of Newsom's Outdoors for All initiative, which received \$9.1 million for three years starting in 2021-22.

- Miller building roof leak roofer needs to come out while pouring rain to trace the water leaks.

JFK

- We are following up with City groundskeeper supervisor on the status of those trees that touch the building.
- City contractor is working on fixing the plaster that's pulling away from the wall on south side of the building above the individual study nooks.
- Work has begun to repair fire damage from January 2023.

COLLECTIONS, RESOURCES & SERVICES

Collections

Current Projects

- 1. Graphic novel reclassification is ongoing with the purpose to make them easier to find.
- 2. We are ordering best sellers a year in advance to see if that improves our chances of receiving books by street date. The vendor has a "first in, first out" policy, so the sooner we place our orders, the more likely we are to receive them by street date.
- 3. The J Bilingual opening day collection has been ordered. It will some time before this collection is released due to its specific cataloging needs. Existing bilingual picture books will be pulled in, re-cataloged, and then added to this collection.
- 4. Merchandising Committee meets meeting monthly and offers suggestions to each branch for optimizing space for displays and face-outs.

Upcoming Projects

- 1. Gardening tools collection release date is March 15, 2024. Fairfield Civic Center Library, Dixon Library, and Vallejo JFK Library will host this collection. Tools will not float or leave the branch to fill holds. Holds must be picked up and returned at the owning location.
- 2. Dash robots will be ready for circulation in mid-February.

IT / Technology

Current Projects

- 1. The ongoing server migration project continues its transformation of 32 aging physical servers into a modern, efficient virtual environment. This strategic initiative aims to enhance operational flexibility, reduce maintenance costs, and improve security and scalability. By consolidating these servers into a virtual infrastructure, the organization anticipates streamlined management, increased resource utilization, and a reduced carbon footprint.
- 2. IT and marketing are also working together to implement our new digital signage software. Rollout is slated for January 2024.

- 3. Library IT is in the process of implementing a new, state-of-the-art IT infrastructure monitoring software. With this new software in place, the IT team will have real-time visibility into the health and performance of the library's entire IT infrastructure, allowing us to proactively identify and address potential issues.
- 4. The forthcoming mobile app is currently being built out. We hope to have it ready for the public in April 2024. The app will allow patrons to reserve a room, register for an event, and manage their library account.
- 5. MessageBee is a new notification service that will allow us to send native text messages (fewer will get trapped in SPAM filters), customize email messages, and send phone call notices. This will be ready in early February.

Upcoming Projects

- 1. IT will be replacing 28 self-check stations with ELO touch self-checkouts this year. The upgrade will create a more efficient and user-friendly experience. RFP for this will close 01/11/2024.
- 2. To enhance the education experience of our youngest library patrons, IT will be replacing our aging AWE computers with newer more robust technology. Anticipated rollout will be completed by June of 2024.

PROGRAMS & PARTNERSHIPS

WIC Books 4 Kids Distribution

Health and Social Services' (HSS) division of Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) is once again partnering with Solano County Library to provide free book bundles (three books, a book bag, and informational handouts) for participating families to pick up at four library locations: Dixon Library, Fairfield Civic Center Library, Vacaville Town Square Library, and Vallejo JFK Library. Books are available for families with kids age five (5) and under that are WIC clients starting at the end of January. This is the second year of this collaborative partnership. Funding for this project is provided by California's Department of Public Health.

Sustaining Solano

Solano County Library received a grant from the California State Library for the Sustainable California Libraries Project. The Library's Sustaining Solano project will offer open-air events at partner locations and invite partners to offer events in-library. The library will transport adults, children, and families to partnering open spaces and farms where they will meet experts and talk about how parks, gardening, and open spaces provide both palpable and intangible benefit to the people of Solano County. As part of this grant, all Solano County Library locations will have seed libraries. Library staff are in the process of ordering seed containers and seeds to launch the collection in the Spring.
